Jesus reminds us that the Good Shepherd differs from the hired hand because he does not run away when he sees the wolf coming.

Do we have the attitude in faith and through life of running away from danger, or facing up to it and dealing with it? There are plenty of wolves around even today, and a false sense of security may lead us to forget the need for vigilance and courage.
