hen the Sun Goes Down

(It tends to reach the yardarm several hours before that, mercifully ...)

At the Ending of the Day was the name of the broadcast of plainsong Compline on the Home Service on Sundays; it would be good if we could occasionally sing Compline here in that sublimely peaceful way.

Today Saint Paul tells the Ephesians not to allow the sun to go down on their wrath. This is among the things we all need to do at the end of each day: to seek God's peace and commit our lives to God for the coming night.

Strange though it may seem, what we do at the end of the day is probably the most important discipline of our lives. Leave behind the often unpleasant business of the day and commit your sleep to God to start anew when you wake.
