There is a three-fold movement in today's Gospel passage: Jesus is recognised and affirmed by his Father; he goes into the wild parts of the world where he is made to fall back onto his relationship with the Father as a result of the severe temptations of Satan; he appears and immediately tells all who will listen that the time is fulfilled.

To fulfil the time is to accept recognition and praise from God alone, and to know and reject the emptiness of the blandishments of the world, together with the temptations to replace God with the things of creation, or even to set ourselves in the place of God.

Lent is a time when our relationship with God can be fulfilled by repentance and faith in the good news of Jesus. Our human nature shares the need Jesus had to discover the emptiness of a world without God. Since by adoption through baptism we have come to share the divine nature itself in the depth of our being, we are able to choose repentance and rejoice in the Good News.

A reading from the Book of Genesis

Genesis 9.8-17

Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, 'As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth.' God said, This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness for forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him.

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'
