ow to Heal

The bronze serpent heals the people of Israel from the snake-bites, and, most important, it heals them from their disobedience to God and to Moses.

The motto of the school where I was educated was (I hope still is...) Serve and Obey. Disobedience was dealt with quickly and often brutally, and it was often similar at home, given that both my parents were brought up in households where obedience was expected, and when it was not received, the rod was not spared.

Rods, serpents and other things are during the Exodus instruments of both punishment and healing, and the Exodus itself is in some ways a journey between the two, from the punishment of exile in Egypt to the healing of the Promised Land.

The painful and unwelcome corrections of this life can come over as cruel punishment, yet within the embracing arc of God's love they become a spur to healing and reconciliation. God sent his Son not to condemn the world but that the world may be saved.

Collect Prayer

Merciful Lord, absolve your people from their offences, that through your bountiful goodness we may all be delivered from the chains of those sins which by our frailty we have committed; grant this, heavenly Father, for Jesus Christ's sake, our blessed Lord and Saviour, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

A reading from the Book of Numbers Numbers 21.4-9

From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. The people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food.' Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live.' So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to Saint John Glory to you, O Lord John 3.14-21

Jesus said, 'And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgement, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ
