As for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.
