There will be a series of addresses given by the Vicar at **Evensong** on the first five Sundays of Lent, exploring Jesus in the Gospel accounts.

# Lenten Discipline

Many people like to observe Lent by giving something up or some other formal **penance**. Please consider how your discipline will serve your own spiritual growth or can be of service to others.

The traditional **Fast Days** in Lent are **Ash Wednesday** and each **Friday**. If you feel able to go without a meal on these days, you may wish to donate the money you would have spent to others who are in need.

## Holy Week and Easter—all timings are on the back page

Weather permitting, the **Procession of Palms** will begin outside the Saints Parish Centre, moving across the churchyard into the church.

**The Vicar** will offer a series of addresses throughout Holy Week, entitled *Matters of Life and Death*.

On Maundy Thursday, the **Mass of the Lord's Supper** will include the **Washing of Feet** in commemoration of our Lord's commandment of love and service. The **Watching** in the Holy Cross Chapel will conclude with the reading from John's Gospel of the **Last Discourse of Christ**, starting at 11.00 p.m.

On **Good Friday**, Fr Iain will lead a Stations of the Cross devotion from 1.30 p.m., followed by the **Liturgy** at its traditional time of 3.00 p.m.

The **Easter Vigil** will begin after sunset, at 8.00 p.m. on Holy Saturday. It should end by 10.00 p.m., and champagne and chocolate eggs will be on offer to round off the celebration!

## Praying through Lent

Please find in the remainder of this booklet a form of prayer which you may wish to use daily during Lent.

Suitable Scripture readings could include the Mass readings of the day (find these online at http://almanac.oremus.org and clicking or pressing View), or you could read through the Book of Exodus chapter by chapter (40 chapters for 40 days of Lent), or chapter by chapter through the Gospel of Matthew, which is this year's Gospel – or both!

#### **Opening Prayers**

We stand before the throne of God with countless crowds from every nation and race, tribe and language.

Blessing and glory and wisdom, thanksgiving and honour, power and might be to our God for ever and ever. Amen.

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### The Confession

Man born of woman has but a short time to live. We have our fill of sorrow. We blossom like a flower and wither away. We slip away like a shadow and do not stay. Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

In the midst of life we are in death; where can we turn for help? Only to you, Lord, who are justly angered by our sins. Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us. Shut not your ears to our prayers, but spare us, O Lord. Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

You know the secrets of our hearts; forgive us our sins. Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

Eternal and merciful judge, both in life and when we come to die, let us not fall away from you. Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and merciful Saviour, do not abandon us to the bitterness of eternal death.

A Scripture Reading – either from the Mass of the day, or from one of the suggested books of the Bible

A time of silent reflection – on the reading, on the issues and needs of the day, followed by:

Verses from Psalm 130

Out of the depths I have called to you, Lord. Let your ears be open to hear my voice. My hope is in God's word.

If you recorded all our sins who could come before you? My hope is in God's word.

There is forgiveness with you: therefore you shall be feared. **My hope is in God's word.**  My soul is longing for the Lord, more than those who watch for daybreak. My hope is in God's word.

O Israel, wait for the Lord, for with the Lord there is mercy. **My hope is in God's word.** 

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. **My hope is in God's word.** 

#### Profession of Faith

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holv catholic Church. the communion of saints. the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Make us alive to the needs of our community: help us to share each other's joys and burdens.

Look with kindness on our homes and families: grant that your love may grow in our hearts.

Deepen our compassion for all who suffer from sickness, grief or trouble:

#### in your presence may they find their strength.

We remember those who have died:

#### Father, into your hands we commend them.

We praise you for all your saints who have entered your eternal glory:

### bring us all to share in your heavenly kingdom.
