

G od's Children Remembered We read so much in Scripture about remembering the works of God, and at the heart of our worship lies the remembrance of the sacrifice of Jesus, which brings healing to the world.



So much so that it is easy to neglect the way in which *God* remembers *us*. We are reminded today of the relentless nature of God's love. God keeps coming back again and again to seek us, even when we have given ourselves up, let alone stopped thinking of the God of love.

The appearance of John the Baptist in the wilderness may seem frightening to us, yet Luke presents this as the historical turning-point when God in Jesus starts to prove—once again—that God never forgets us.

So if God never forgets us, let's go back to the first question and ask how easy we find it to forget God, especially as the pre-Christmas pressure mounts up, and let's make sure we remember before it is too late.

Collect Prayer

O Lord, raise up, we pray, your power and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness we are grievously hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen**

A reading from the Book of Baruch

Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction, O Jerusalem, and put on for ever the beauty of the glory from God. Put on the robe of the righteousness that comes from God; put on your head the diadem of the glory of the Everlasting; for God will show your splendour everywhere under heaven. For God will give you evermore the name, 'Righteous Peace, Godly Glory'.

Arise, O Jerusalem, stand upon the height; look towards the east, and see your children gathered from west and east at the word of the Holy One, rejoicing that God has remembered them. For they went out from you on foot, led away by their enemies; but God will bring them back to you, carried in glory, as on a royal throne. For God has ordered that every high mountain and the everlasting hills be made low and the valleys filled up, to make level ground, so that Israel may walk safely in the glory of God. The woods and every fragrant tree have shaded Israel at God's command. For God will lead Israel with joy, in the light of his glory, with the mercy and righteousness that come from him.

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to Luke Glory to you, O Lord

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the highpriesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah, 'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.
