
Several times God speaks to Israel through Isaiah, telling the people not to fear—and not to withhold the overflowing grace and joy of God from anyone who comes to seek the Lord.

When at his baptism Jesus is revealed as the one in whom God's Spirit lives, he is also revealed as the one who will not withhold the Spirit.

It is the leadership of the faith and of the nation who have not heard the words of God telling them not to fear, and who are withholding God's love and grace from the peoples—and who withhold recognition of what God wishes to accomplish in Jesus.

They are tired, small-minded and meanspirited. This is why they are afraid. Their religion has become one of power, and they hold on to it jealously.

Eternal Father, who at the baptism of Jesus revealed him to be your Son, anointing him with the Holy Spirit: grant to us, who are born again by water and the Spirit, that we may be faithful to our calling as your adopted children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah Isaiah 43.1-7

But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals.

'He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowingfork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'
