Jesus predicts the fall of the Temple, which was in fact sacked and destroyed by the Romans in AD70. He does this as a response to people who were admiring the greatness and the permanence of it.



As he frequently does when he sees people putting their trust in the things of this world or in themselves, Jesus reminds us of the insecure and passing nature of all things.

This season of the year, when we start to think about the second coming of Jesus—and the four last things, Death, Judgement, Heaven & Hell—is a good time for us to reconsider where it is we put our trust.

In ourselves? We should already know how easily we ourselves fail. In others? Why should they be any different? In material things? Ask anyone who has been relying on a failed harvest, or a 'secure' job that has suddenly disappeared!

The only person worthy of our trust—who can take us through this life and through into eternity—is Jesus himself. His offer is always open. How shall we respond?

But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls.'
