A good part of the symbolism of Advent involves the light that Jesus shines on the world—including ourselves—when he comes.

At the end of time, that light will be a light of judgement and of justice; in his coming at Christmas the light is seen as a star which draws people from far and wide to worship him. Where then does the light shine when he comes to the world of today?

That light is entrusted to you and to me. It is entrusted to us as members of Christ's Church. It is a light that we can choose to shine out or to obscure.

That light is obscured when the Church is small-minded, tawdry and flawed; the light shines when we are generous, open and filled with God's love—in practical charity not just as a nice feeling.

Advent gives us the chance to clear away those things in us which obscure the light, so that by Christmas the light of Christ in us may shine out clear and far.

Jesus told his disciples, 'About that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man.

Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming.
